District 11 Goals SY 2021-22 (DRAFT)

High Expectations and Rigorous Instruction

District Goal #1: The effective use of screeners to improve the quality of interventions/enrichment and improve the quality (rigor and responsiveness) of Tier 1 instruction. By June 2022, we will engage in a minimum of three progress monitoring sessions using district-level data (e.g. New Visions/Data tracking systems) to measure the impact of our borough-wide strategy of implementing data-driven cycles of improvement that result in a rigorous and culturally responsive core (Tier 1) and improved quality of interventions and enrichment (Tiers 2 and 3). By emphasizing the use of universal screeners as a necessary data point to accelerate learning across targeted areas (early childhood, literacy, and math in grades K-12) we will increase the belief that a culturally responsive core and asset-based quality interventions equip students to read, write, speak, listen deeply and think critically.

Welcoming and Affirming Environment

District Goal #2: By June 2022, we will improve overall attendance to 94% and reduce chronic absenteeism to 26% by creating a welcoming and affirming environment for students and embedding relationship building and self management modules in all aspects of the school community. All teachers will create spaces that center student voices and nurturing opportunities for learners to connect to each other in relevant and meaningful ways around their identities, strengths, and challenges they are facing so as to provide feedback that leverages their knowledge to unlock the power and joy of learning.

Inclusive Curriculum and Assessments

District Goal #3: By June 2022, all schools will modify a minimum of four to six curricular units of study using the Hill Model ensuring the integration of culture, identity, and perspective as essential components of the learning process through the use of instructional materials written from racially, culturally, and linguistically diverse perspectives, creating learning experiences that eliminate barriers allowing for greater access for diverse learners. Educators will engage in data monitoring systems and regular progress monitoring that assess how research-based curricula meet the learning needs of diverse students, triangulating multiple methods of authentic assessment data that inform how school staff responds to evolving student outcomes.

Ongoing Professional Learning

District Goal #4: By June 2022, all schools will create time for ongoing and targeted professional learning communities (Instructional Focus Collaborative 2.0) that collaborate regularly to foster purposeful adult learning and meet a minimum of eight times per year to build capacity of educators to create welcoming and affirming environments that center students' lived experiences and make learning responsive, rigorous, and relevant. Adult learning communities will critically examine data, learn together, explore new approaches, and take risks.


