Summer Learning Activities

Reading:

- Reading Challenge: Read and enjoy as many books as you can this summer and write the titles on the tracker.
- You can read books from the library, storylineonline.net or any other resources.
- Complete an activity for 3 books that you've read

Math:

- Imagine Math Challenge – at least 2 days each week.

Writing (Optional)

- Keep a journal and write about your summer activities, thoughts, opinions, or any topic of your choice!



Reading Responses

1. Make a new book cover for the book.
 - Draw and color an illustration to represent the book.
2. Write a comic strip of a scene from your book.
 - There should be at least 4 boxes with illustrations and dialogue between the characters.
 - Comics should be colored neatly.
3. Tell about a character from the book.
 - Draw and color the character.
 - Write about the character:
 - What does he or she look like?
 - What did they do in the story?
 - Why did you like him/her?
4. List facts you learned from the book. (Only for Nonfiction books) • Create a fact sheet that includes at least 3 interesting facts you found out during your reading but did not know before.
 - You can include illustrations or photos to go along with your fact sheet.
5. Write a summary of the book.
 - What happened first?
 - What happened next?
 - What happened last?
